- A subscore of 18 in English and 21 in reading on the ACT, or a subscore of 430 in English and 450 in reading on the SAT. (Students must register to take the ACT or SAT on their own.)

General admission requirements for the Wright State University College Credit Plus program are:

- Satisfaction of the Ohio Remediation Free Standards for the appropriate area of study
- Recommendation of the high school principal/counselor
- College-level placement scores as established by the University
  - English: A score of 23 or above on the ACT English examination, or a score of 530 or above on the SAT Critical Reading and Writing examinations, or a score of 86 or above on the Wright State writing placement examination
  - Social Sciences: A score of 18 or above on the ACT English examination, or a score of 430 or above on the SAT Critical Reading and Writing examinations, or a score of 82 or above on the Wright State writing placement examination
- Satisfaction of all prerequisites for the selected course(s)

College Credit Plus applicants must submit the following

- College Credit Plus Application
- ACT/SAT scores (if available)
- Principal/counselor recommendation
- Official high school transcript

Wright State University College Credit Plus application due date: May 1

Placement testing due date: June 1
